II. Revelation 6: The first Six Seals Judgements

- a. A background on Judgements
 - i. From chapter 5, we saw the scroll being read contains the history & destiny of mankind & creation, and only Jesus the Lamb had the right to loosen the seals on this scroll of the
 - ii. If the scroll details the culmination of history, the things associated with the removal of the seals must happen *before* the scroll is opened. It's not the fulfillment of history itself, but the *preparation* for it. (note: The actual culmination is detailed in Revelation 19)
 - iii. The 'Seal Judgements" are referred to in both Revelation 6:1-17 (seals 1-6) & the final 7th Seal in Revelation 8:1-5 (Chapter 7 is an
 - iv. There are 3 sets of judgements: Seal, Trumpet & Bowl

- b. The first 4 seals of the Scroll bring 4 Horsemen (verses 1-2)
 - i. "... behold, a white horse": this isn't a cowboy movie, & the guy on a white horse isn't a good guy. Jesus does return on a white horse in Rev 19:11-16; but this is a satanic dictator who imitates
 - ii. He rules ("a crown was given"); he rules with a bow, not a sword; and he exercises dominion over the earth ("went out conquering and to conquer").
 - iii. A bow can represent falsehood, deceit (Psalms 64:3 & 64:4 ; Hosea 7:16 ; Jeremiah 9:3).
 - iv. "The whole context and character of these seals absolutely forbid our thinking of this rider being the Lord Jesus, as so many affirm. *Jesus'* reign shall not bring war, famine, and strife in its train." (Jennings Bible Commentary)
 - v. <u>NOTE:</u> This can be an interpretive crossroad of the Book of Revelation. You can sometimes tell much about how a person understands this book and God's <u>prophetic plan</u> by how they see this first rider. Those who think Revelation is mostly a book of *history* (i.e. Preterists) believe that this rider is Jesus, the apostles, or the Roman emperors. Those who believe that this is a <u>prophetic</u> passage, yet to be fulfilled, usually see this rider to be the antichrist.
 - vi. "He went out conquering and to conquer": he will be more terrible than all previous dictators. He'll rule over men as a <u>false messiah</u>, and lead man in organized rebellion against God, in the pattern of Nimrod, his 1st predecessor.
- vii. The idea of a satanic dictator over men goes back to Nimrod, the ruler over Babel in <u>Genesis 10:8-14</u>, where it says he was a "*mighty hunter before the LORD*". Here he will be a mighty hunter of *men*, an offensive to God.



- viii. "Come and see": With the war, political uncertainty in the US, economic fragility, etc., modern political & social scene is primmed for the emergence of such a political leader. All that waits is for the Lord to allow it in His timing.
- ix. "And now you know what is restraining, that he may be revealed in his own time. For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work; only He who now restrains will do so until He is taken out of the way." (2 Thessalonians 2:6-7)
- x. The first seal opened brings this dictator to prominence. The Seventieth week of Daniel 9 begins when this dictator will <u>"confirm a covenant with [the] many</u>", referring to the Jewish people.
- c. The 'Red Horse' brings war and conflict (verses 3-4)
 - i. "Another horse, fiery red, went out. And it was granted to the one who sat on it to take peace from the earth": This rider won't <u>bring</u> war and destruction. All he'll need to do is <u>take</u> peace from the earth. Peace is God's gift to man. Once taken, men rush in with war & destruction.
 - ii. Peace between men & among nations is a gift from God. It is <u>NOT</u> the *natural* state of relations between men, but a result of Adam's fall.
 - iii. "... and it was granted": This authority was granted to the horseman. This is, directly or indirectly, the judgment of God.
 - iv. "... that people should kill one another.": Our modern age is marked by war and conflict. Since World War II, there have been more than ______ 'State-Sponsored' conflicts. (3.6/yr)
- d. The Black Horse brings scarcity & inequity (verses 5-6)
 - i. "A black horse, and he who sat on it had a pair of scales in his hand": Scales imply need to carefully measure & ration food, inferring scarcity.
 - ii. "a quart of wheat for a denarius, and three quarts of barley for a denarius": These prices are about 12x higher than normal. This means it would cost a day's wage to buy the ingredients for a loaf of bread. This describes "a time of famine when life will be reduced to the barest necessities." (John Walvoord, "The Revelation of Jesus Christ")
 - iii. "... do not harm the oil and the wine": Yet, the nicer things will still be available for those who can afford them. There will still be the oil and the wine that should not be harmed.
- e. The Pale Horse brings death (verses 7-8)
 - i. "... a pale horse. And the name of him who sat on it was Death": This last rider shows there will be a tremendous death toll from the dictator, war, famine & other calamities described by the previous 3 horsemen.
 - ii. Jesus said of this time For then there will be great tribulation, such as has not been since the beginning of the world until this time, no, nor ever shall be. (Matthew 24:21)
 - iii. "And power was given to them over a fourth of the earth, to kill with sword, with hunger, with death, and by the beasts of the earth." Power was given to the horseman, and given by God. Though all hell breaks loose on the earth, God is ALWAYS very much in control. He still holds the scroll and opens the seals.
- f. The 5th & 6th Seals are opened (verses 9-11)
 - i. The fifth seal brings forth the 'cry of the martyrs'.
 - ii. "I saw under the altar the souls of those who had been slain for the word of God": As the souls were <u>under the altar</u> it shows their life blood was poured out as an offering to God. (see Lev. 4:7)
 - iii. It's best to see this as an example of the cry of all martyrs for God's truth.
 - iv. We don't think of God's people crying out for vengeance, but here it's clearly stated they made their cry to God, & leave the matter to Him.
 - v. When God's people are persecuted, _______. It isn't wrong for God's people to ask Him to do what He promised (Corrie Ten Boom).
 - vi. The blood of Abel cried out from the ground for vengeance (Gen 4:10).
- vii. "It was said to them that they should rest a little while longer": These saints were instructed to wait... but how long must they wait?
- viii. "... until both the number of their fellow servants and their brethren, who would be killed as they were, was completed". This may mean that they should wait until all God's appointed martyrs are killed.
- ix. We are to be WITNESSES for Chris. It is character the way that one *lives* that makes a martyr, but that can include the way that one *dies*.
- x. The Greek word for witness is ... martus (mar-toos μάρτυς), from where we get our word 'martyr'
- xi. We can sometimes forget the full cost of being 'witnesses for Christ'
- g. The 6th seal brings cosmic disruption
 - i. Prior examples: Zephaniah 1:14-16 & Joel 2:10-11
 - ii. "The sun became black as sackcloth of hair, and the moon became like blood. And the stars of heaven fell to the earth": It is best to regard these pictures as real, but poetic.
 - iii. And the kings of the earth, the great men, the rich men, the commanders, the mighty men, every slave and every free man, hid themselves: All people are equally brought low by God's wrath.
 - iv. **Hide us from the face of Him who sits on the throne**: They hid not only from the terror of the judgments, but **from the face of Him who sits on the throne**.
- h. "Who is able to stand"?

- i. Only believers justified by grace through faith in Jesus Christ, the only One who can offer salvation.
